Recipe of the Month



Blackberry Peach Crumble

2 cups fresh blackberries

1/2 cup all-purpose flour

2 cups peeled and sliced fresh peaches 1/2 cup chopped blanched almonds, or 1 (16 ounce) bag frozen peach slices, (optional)

1/4 teaspoon salt 1 teaspoon grated lemon peel

6 tablespoons butter, cut into pieces

2 tablespoons cornstarch

⅓ **cup,** plus **½ cup** packed brown sugar

Combine blackberries peaches lemon peel, cornstarch and 1/3 cup brown sugar

in a large bowl. Pour ingredients into a lightly greased 8 Yield: 8, ½ cup servings inch baking dish.

Mix together flour, almonds, salt, and remaining ½ cup brown sugar. With pastry
blender or two knives, cut in the butter

Mix together flour, almonds, salt, and re14 g fat, 25 mgcholesterol, 135 mg sodium,
