


Plant Swap Information



Fall is a great time for dividing and transplanting your perennials or houseplants! Have too many of one thing? Bring them to the PLANT SWAP to share and swap for other plants.

Please! Healthy, pest-free plants only...

Pest multiple and spread very quickly and bringing one plant with any pests could potentially be a full-blown infestation. So, before you decide on which plants to bring with you, check the leaves, roots, and the soil to make sure it is pest-free. You would not want to take home a sick plant or unwanted pests, so make sure you do the same for others. Also, put you plants in pots, bags or boxes individually and make sure they are correctly identified and have care directions.

- Weather permitting, swap will be outside, at the Morton Building behind the Extension Office
- Master Gardeners arrive between 8:00-8:30 AM to get set up; Plant Swap will not start until 9 a.m.
- **❖** Both perennials and house plants are acceptable
- Plants do not have to be in pots; bare roots are acceptable
- Bring extra boxes or bags for bare roots
- Please complete a care sheet for each variety so others will know the variety, care tips, planting information, etc. Others wishing to take your plant home can take a picture of the care sheets for their reference
- Any plants left at the end of the swap will be given away or put in dumpster if not taken
